





Is a systematic inquiry designed to develop nursing knowledge about issues of importance to our profession, including perioperative practice, education, and administration.



District 10 The Patient Experience Study

(Qualitative Study) Three questions asked to outpatient orthopedic patients over age 18 re: what their expectations are for surgery (see Study below)

*Qualitative Research*: Research dealing with phenomena that are difficult or impossible to quantify mathematically, such as beliefs, meanings, attributes, and symbols

### District 10 Research







District 14 *Essential Oils to Reduce Post-Operative Nausea and Vomiting* (Double-Blind Study)

The purpose of this study is to determine if using commercial essential oil products (Peppermint or Ginger or a mixture of Peppermint and Ginger) reduces the need for sedating pharmacologic antiemetics for postoperative nausea and vomiting (PONV)

**Double Blind Study:** an experiment designed to test the effect of a treatment or substance by using groups of interventional and control subjects in which neither the subjects nor the investigators know which treatment or substance is being administered to which group

The Patient Experience Study-Outpatient orthopedic patients (18-65 yrs. old). Three questions pre-arrival to hospital:

- 1. What are your expectations upon arrival to the hospital (looking for what they expect once they arrive on hospital  $P_{1}$  and  $P_{2}$  and  $P_{2}$  and  $P_{2}$  and  $P_{2}$  and  $P_{2}$  are the local statement of  $P_{2}$  and  $P_{2}$ 
  - Property: Valet? And escort to floor? A map? A warm blanket?)
- 2. What are your expectations for nursing care while at the facility? (1:1 ratio? Communication? Etc.)
- 3. What are your expectations for pain? (some, none, meds to go home with?).

These questions are very broad, however the responses so far are intriguing. The follow up phone calls asks if we met the expectations of the patient on each question – reminding them of the original answers and if there was anything we could have done differently. The responses we have gotten are interesting. Jean Watson reviewed this study along with the researchers and is excited to see the results. Finally, we hope we can incorporate the **Caritas Theory** into the results. *Caritas Nursing* is a term that is defined as bringing caring, love and heart-centered human to human practices back into our personal life and work world (Watson, 2009).

### District 10 Future Research

Orthopedic Protein Study:

This study is in it's early stage and not ready for IRB. Background: Will keeping selected patients on a high protein drink 10 days before surgery and an additional 4 days following discharge promote quick healing and recovery? Our hypothesis is whether or not high protein diets help patients gain energy and recover sooner from the stress of hip/knee replacement surgery. The literature is overwhelming that protein and better surgical outcomes are related. Does this pre-operative nutrition better prepare the patient for surgery? — Stay Tuned



Postoperative Urinary Retention Study: Purpose: This purpose of this research is to examine the extent to which postoperative urinary retention (POUR) remains a complication following discharge from ambulatory surgery. — Stay Tuned

Being led by Phase II nursing staff at Strong Memorial Hospital (SMH) in Rochester, New York including Sandra Price (NYSPANA Treasurer and Chris Deitrick (Up to Par Editor) and other NYSPANA nurses. As part of the Boards ongoing commitment to provide resources for New York State's perianesthesia nurses we will be reviewing and updating the requirement for obtaining funds to support research and evidenced -based projects. Currently a \$500 stipend is available to qualified researchers through a very extensive process. We are proposing changes in the procedure and types of projects that would be eligible for a \$1000 grant. This grant could be used to support cost of carrying out a project such as materials and/or equipment, software purchase or consultant fees.

In these editorials the author discusses the opportunities for nursing research where nurses interact with patients including through information technology, tele-health, collection of personal information, and devices used at the point of care. Communication issues will always be areas for improvement in the delivery of health care and nurses can promote those changes by investigating current modes of communication and trying new approaches that can better meet the needs of those we care for. Designing and testing teaching materials or revising instructional programs are two areas that can be improved through researching patients responses and perceptions. There is always a need to update how we communicate and teach, especially with increased use of smart devices.

I was fortunate to be 1 of 1700 attendees in Sunny California, a fun component night Sunday with all states represented from a California nurse in a an Oscar costume to three ladies from North Carolina depicting members of the Andy Griffith show cast.

Some of the sessions that stood out were: Clinical practice, pointing out that all clinical queries can be found on ASPAN.org, check nursing forums, use the standards book, ultimately patient safety is our responsibility, no set time for recovery->patient is ready for discharge when criteria is met.

There was also much discussion about our nationwide *opioid* epidemic. Interestingly, probability of long term opioid use increases after five days, 6% after only one day of therapy. At one Ohio hospital, for those pre-op patients with a dependence on Suboxone, when surgery is scheduled, they obtain a comprehensive urine screen the day surgery is scheduled, then repeat on the day of surgery, testing for all drugs other than Suboxone. Surgeon and primary MD have a plan in place for pain management prior to surgery! Recommendation from American Addiction Society how *states* pre-op patient only has to be off Suboxone 24 hours rather than five days as stated previously.

My experience at the ASPAN conference was truly inspirational to my nursing practice. Arriving in the summy state of California was a blessing and that was only the beginning. I entered the conference setting and found that I was surrounded with some of the best Perianesthesia nurses in the country. The classes I attended were hand picked in hopes to further my nursing practice and I quickly learned that the classes were not the only thing I could grow from. Classes with topics such as substance abuse in patient population, post traumatic stress symptoms, and aiding new staff become involved with patient emergencies were only the beginning of my learning experiences. The most enlightening session, in my opinion, was baby boomers to generation Z and the impact of generational differences in Perianesthesia nursing, how each generation is a product of the culture they grow up in. For leaders, and managers, is recognizing differences and how best to communicate, the challenge of generational conflict, finding common ground, providing communication options, ie: email, texting.

What stood out to me in the Exhibit Hall, was an interchangeable **BIPAP/CPAP** device developed by a respiratory therapist. It consisted of a mask with a gauge in the tubing that is switched to either mode and connected to  $O_2$  flow meter, cost is about \$40, something we (nurses) could apply and initiate, food for thought.

District 13 is presently working on planning the NYSPANA State Conference in November 2018



### District 10 - Adirondack Health Mud Season Seminar

On April 21st the Adirondack Health Professional Development Committee and NYSPANA District 10 cosponsored a Seminar day at the newly re-opened Hotel Saranac in Saranac Lake, NY. For the 47 nurses in attendance it was a chance to network with other professionals as well as earn CEUs.

The topics were quite varied. An introduction to fecal transplantation by Stephanie Rollo RN and Nicole Young RN provide great information about the process and their GI program in Glens Falls. Recently retired Maureen Iacono brought her unending enthusiasm for nursing and provided truly insightful tips for handling difficult conversations. Dr. Michael Hill provided

attendees with the opportunity to hear directly from a patient of his who is undergoing gastric balloon placement for weight loss. This is a new non-medical, non surgical weight loss method that has been used in Europe and South America for years but is now being trialed in the United States.

Though we had our challenges because of the distance involved, this joint effort proved worth it. The combination of a shared governance committee dedicated to bringing learning opportunities closer to home coupled with the resources of a regional and state organization worked well. Bringing nursing professional development to one of the most rural parts of the state was very rewarding. Lessons learned included the importance of starting early with the CEU approval process. Though everything was submitted by the deadline there were many weeks of communication back and forth to someone who was good with details helped immensely. Pick a date and secure speakers as soon as possible . Plan for an extra presentation or 2 as speakers sometimes change plans. It takes a few weeks to gather bios, conflict of interest forms and presentation outlines and these are

and presentation outlines and these are needed for the CEU application. It is recommended to get set up PayPal registrations 4-6 months ahead also. When working with the venue take care to estimate attendee numbers as accurately as possible, set up reasonable dates for final numbers and be cautious about minimums written in to any contract. The hotel contract needed to be adjusted for our meeting as our budget was

not as flexible as corporate type events. Also be sure it covers any AV and equipment needs ahead of time and outlines timing of food and beverage service to your liking. We found the hotel very flexible and that it worked best to have two people that they could contact and work with during the planning process.

Both the district and the hospital worked on getting speakers. Our district NYSPANA treasurer did an outstanding job managing the incoming registrations and the outgoing payments. The local committee handled the conference day responsibilities including vendor needs, door prize raffle and manning the registration table. Our joint efforts made for a well received event and have encouraged us not be afraid to think big and think local to meet the education needs of North Country nurses.
